Christmas Fabric Wreath

supplies

- Wire wreath frame (I used 8")
- Fabric strips (about 8 1/2" x 1 1/2" long) I used a fat quarter bundle from Hobby Lobby.

tools

Pinking shears or fabric scissors

instructions

1 Cut your fabric strips to 8 1/2" x 1 1/2" using your pinking shears. You can prepare a bunch of strips now.





Starting on one of the sections of the wreath, follow each wire piece and tie on the fabric strips, I like to do one wire section at a time. Tie all of the strips on making sure the ends are even and they are all facing the same direction.



Christmas Fabric Wreath

Continue tying until you have filled the entire wire frame.





You can trim your fabric strips if you want at this stage or add any embellishments like a bow, tiny ornaments, etc.
