

Clay Hot Cocoa Mug

supplies

- Model magic clay-Mug color (I used aquamarine), Candy cane-red and white, Cocoa-brown
- Mini white pom poms (marshmallows)
- Glitter glue puff paint (silver)
- Scrap paper
- Parchment paper (or something to work on)
- White school glue

instructions

- 1 Start with the mug, I like to create a short cylinder shape for the main part of the mug and then make a hole in the top to create the opening.
- 2 Roll a small “snake” shape for the mug handle, and attach it to the side of your mug.

Take a small piece of scrap paper and make it into a ball and put it inside the mug. (I use this so that I don't waste clay)

Candy cane: Roll a small piece of red clay and a small piece of white clay into a "snake" shape and then twist them together to create a candy cane shape, bend the end to create the "crook" shape.

Place your candy cane into the mug on one edge.

With the brown clay make a small disc shape that will fit on the inside of the mug opening. I create a small cut-out to fit around the candy cane. Place it inside the mug.

You can let your mug dry completely at this stage. Add small dots of glue on top of your “hot cocoa” and then place the mini white pom poms on top.

Using glitter glue paint, create your design on the side of the mug, I make a snowflake but you can make what ever design you like. Let your mug dry completely.



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- 1 Keep all fabric folded (selvage edges are lined up).
- 2 Stack the main fabric, border  lining up the folds of the fabric and trim (using your rotary cutter, ruler, and self-healing mat) off all selvage edges to make them all even.
