supplies

- Canvas tote bag, if you do the mummy try to find a black tote bag.
- Felt sheets 9" x 12" (Frankensteinblack, green, grey, white)
 (Mummy-white, black)
- Embroidery floss that coordinates with the template you are using.

tools

- Fabric scissors
- Chenille needle (big eye, sharp tip)
- Hot glue/gun (If you do not want to sew.
- Printed templates

instructions

- Place your scrap paper inside your tote bag to prevent the two sides from sticking.
- 2 Cut out all the pieces of your template.
 Frankenstein-(face, bolts, hair) OR Mummy-(outer eye, inner eye).





Trace them onto the felt pieces.





4 Cut all felt pieces out.

Thread your needle with the embroidery floss you want to use for accents. I used all six strands. Tie a knot at the end and start in the back of your felt to hide the knot.





Optional: Stitch an outline around the face using the running stitch. Glue or sew the eyes on the face (I sewed mine on). When you need a new thread, make sure to make a loop in the back and tie a knot to secure it.





I used 3-6 strands of black embroidery floss for the smile and stitches using the backstitch.



Once all the pieces have their accents you can glue them to your tote bag. I find that you need quite a bit of glue to secure the pieces. Add the glue to the back of your felt pieces and place it on your bag.





If you are doing the mummy bag, you will do the same process by cutting out the eyepieces, and then I just cut strips of white felt and placed them randomly on my bag and glued them down as I went. I did not use any accent stitching on the mummy bag.



Let the glue dry completely and you have a new trick or treat tote bag!
